Introduction

Colombia is a middle income country with huge economic potential, but it is plagued by conflict and natural disasters.

Political violence is endemic in this South American nation of 47 million people, despite its long tradition of multi-party democracy and regular elections.

The government has been waging a civil war against two separate left-wing guerrilla movements for nearly half a century.

Since the 1980s right-wing paramilitaries protecting the interests of large land owners and highly organised criminal gangs of drug traffickers have also come on the scene.

The drug gangs employ large numbers of heavily armed guards and assassins.

They use their own planes, ships and even submarines to export processed drugs to North America and Europe, often via third countries in Central America, the Caribbean and West Africa.

The drug cartels also hide consignments of cocaine, marijuana and heroin in ordinary commercial cargo.

All the armed factions that claim a political agenda have turned to criminal activities such as extortion, kidnapping and drug trafficking to fund themselves.

The frontiers between politically motivated violence and criminality for financial gain have become increasingly blurred.

Colombia is one of the world's largest suppliers of cocaine. It also grows large quantities of marijuana and opium poppies for the manufacture of heroin.

All those involved in the fighting have committed horrific human rights abuses.

Extra-judicial executions and mass killings are common.

According to human rights organisations, the insurgent groups have an established practice of recruiting child soldiers.

In recent years, the leftist guerrilla groups FARC and ELN have made increasing use of mines and roadside bombs. These often cause high civilian casualties.

Rural families suffer the brunt of this conflict, especially those living in remote rural areas where most of the drug cultivation takes place.

The armed factions not only control the drugs trade. They have also moved into mining areas to develop protection rackets.

Their gunmen extort money from companies operating in the oil and gas sector and also from artisanal miners of gold, emeralds and other precious minerals.

Oil companies which refuse to pay up can expect to have their oil pipelines bombed and their vehicles attacked.

Many people have moved out of those parts of the countryside worst affected by fighting.

At the end of 2011, the government estimated there were 3.9 internally displaced people (IDPs) in Colombia. Some NGO estimates put the true figure at over five million.

According to a report by the International Crisis Group published in October 2012, *Colombia: Peace at last?* www.crisisgroup.org/en/regions/latin-america-caribbean/andes/colombia/045-colombia-peace-at-last.aspx, the four departments (provinces) with the highest rates of population displacement in 2011 were Caquetá and Guaviare in the Eastern plains, Chocó on the Pacific coast and Nariño in the far South near the border with Ecuador.

Between 1.2% and 1.8% of the population of these conflict-ridden departments had been forced to leave their homes by lack of security in 2011, it said.

The majority of IDPs end up in the Colombia's main cities.

Although most displaced people abandon their homes to escape conflict, some are the victims of natural disasters.

Volcanoes and earthquakes

Colombia is prone to frequent earthquakes and volcanic eruptions because it sits on the Pacific Ring of Fire.

The tectonic plate beneath the Pacific Ocean slides back into the earth's molten core beneath the Andean mountains along the West coast of South America, provoking frequent earthquakes and volcanic eruptions.

These affect the heavily populated mountainous regions of Central and Western Colombia.

In 1999, an earthquake measuring 6.0 on the Richter scale killed more than a 1,000 people in the town of Armenia in West Central Colombia. A further 160,000 were left homeless.

The Andean mountain ranges of Colombia are dotted with active volcanoes, some of them rising to over 5,000 metres. Many of them erupt frequently.

Earthquakes and landslides associated with volcanic eruptions often cause greater loss of life and human displacement than the outpourings of lava and volcanic ash.

In 1985 an eruption of the snow-capped Nevado del Ruiz volcano in central Colombia triggered a mudflow that buried the town of Armero, killing 25,000 people.

A similar disaster occurred on a smaller scale during the 1994 eruption of Nevado de Huila volcano in south western Colombia.

The eruption triggered an earthquake measuring 6.4 on the Richter scale. This provoked landslides and mud flows that killed 1,200 and made 20,000 homeless.

Several volcanoes lie close to large cities which are constantly at risk.

For example, the southern city of Pasto, with a population of 450,000, lies in the shadow of Galeras volcano. This experienced 17 minor eruptions between 2004 and 2010. A really big one could prove catastrophic.

Flooding

Severe flooding has also caused much human suffering and economic damage.

Normally Colombia has two separate rainy seasons. The first stretches from March to June. The second lasts from October to December.

However, in recent years fluctuations in the ocean currents off the West coast of South America have made the timing and intensity of rainfall less predictable.

A phenomenon known as *La Niña*, sometimes causes the temperature of surface water in the Pacific Ocean off the coast of Colombia and Ecuador to cool by up to five degrees Centigrade. This in turn provokes heavy rainfall in western and central Colombia.

La Niña conditions persisted from mid-2010 until early 2012, provoking torrential rain and serious flooding in many parts of Colombia over a continuous period of nearly two years.

By the end of 2011, more than two million people had been affected by floods across the country. Over 500 people lost their lives and tens of thousands were made homeless.

The floods cut roads, isolated communities and caused heavy economic damage

La Niña conditions finally petered out in April 2012, raising hopes of a return to more normal weather patterns.

Recent history

Colombia was conquered and settled by Spanish colonists in the 16th century.

Today, Spanish is the national language, spoken by nearly everyone, and Roman Catholicism is the dominant religion.

Most Colombians are of mixed race.

The Spaniards mingled with the indigenous South American Indian population that they found living in the country.

They also imported black slaves from Africa to work on plantations near the Caribbean coast.

Today, about two thirds of the population is mixed race. Most of the rest are white European or black African. Only 3% of Colombians are of pure indigenous stock.

Under the leadership of Simon Bolivar, Colombia rebelled against Spanish colonial rule in the early 19th century.

The country declared independence in 1819, but Venezuela and Ecuador broke away to form separate states in 1830.

US influence

As an independent state, Colombia moved rapidly from the Spanish to the US sphere of influence. It remains there today.

The territory of Colombia originally included Panama, but this northern province seceded to become an independent state in 1903.

It broke away with active encouragement from the US government, which was anxious to secure control of the then half-built Panama canal.

US companies are major investors in the Colombian economy and the US government has provided billions of dollars of military aid to help the Colombian government combat left-wing guerrilla groups and drug traffickers.

US military aid to Colombia intensified between 2002 and 2010 during the presidency of Alvaro Uribe to back his successful offensive against the FARC and ELN leftist rebel movements.

By the time Uribe handed over to the current head of state, President Juan Manuel Santos, in 2010, both rebel movements had suffered heavy losses and had reduced the scale of their military activities.

However, they remain far from defeated.

La Violencia and power sharing

Two political parties have dominated Colombian politics ever since independence; the Liberals and the Conservatives.

Rivalry between them has often spilled over into civil war.

The most recent armed conflict between Liberals and Conservatives was triggered by the assassination of the popular Liberal Party leader Jorge Eliecer Gaitan in 1948.

This particular outbreak of conflict was known as *La Violencia* (The Violence). It lasted for more than 10 years.

La Violencia took the form of a guerrilla war in the countryside, away from the main towns and cities.

It set the pattern for the present day conflict between leftist rebel movements and the government army.

In 1953, Colombian army commander General Gustavo Rojas Pinilla took power in a military coup, promising to end *La Violencia*.

But he failed to do so. Fighting between Liberal and Conservative militia groups was still continuing when Rojas Pinilla was forced to resign by popular protests in 1957.

La Violencia finally came to an end in 1958 after the Liberal and Conservative parties agreed to share power for a series of four presidential terms.

Fresh elections were held and the rival armed groups began to disband, although sporadic incidents of rural violence continued for another four years.

The power-sharing pact involved the rotation of the presidency between a Conservative and Liberal head of state for an initial period of 16 years.

Multi-party elections took place regularly, but the Liberal and Conservative parties always supported the same presidential candidate, who then appointed leading figures from both parties to ministerial posts.

This power-sharing formula continued in a modified form until 1986, when the newly elected Liberal President Virgilio Barco Vargas refused to appoint any Conservative Party figures to his cabinet.

FARC and ELN

Shortly after the fighting between Conservatives and Liberals petered out, Marxist guerrillas launched a new rebellion, inspired by the 1959 revolution which had brought Fidel Castro to power in Cuba.

The left-wing insurgency began in 1964 and initially drew support from poor peasants seeking land reform and social justice.

Two main guerrilla movements emerged. These were continuing to fight in the bush in late 2012.

The largest rebel movement is the FARC. This acronym stands for *Fuerzas Armadas Revolucionarias de Colombia* – the Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia

Various Colombian governments have held peace talks with the FARC, but these have so far failed to result in a peace agreement.

In October 2012, President Juan Manuel Santos agreed to hold a new round of peace talks. Negotiations between the two sides began in Cuba a month later.

There was some speculation that the ELN, the smaller of the two rebel movements, the ELN, might join the peace talks at a later stage.

ELN stands for *Ejército de Liberación Nacional* - the National Liberation Army.

FARC and the ELN both suffered heavy military setbacks during the eight-year rule of former President Alvaro Uribe from 2002 to 2010,

With the help of increased military aid from the United States, Uribe managed to roll back the areas controlled by the two guerrilla movements and kill many of their leaders.

More than 12,000 FARC guerrillas were killed during this period and a similar number surrendered.

In 2012, the government estimated that FARC still had 9,000 armed fighters in the bush, while the ELN had about 2,000.

Conflict takes place along a number of “fronts” throughout rural Colombia, where the FARC and ELN strive to maintain areas of influence and control.

Both rebel movements stage hit and run raids from bases in the bush, but neither movement holds any large towns.

During the 1999-2002 peace talks with the FARC, the government allowed the guerrilla movement to control a sanctuary the size of Switzerland around the town of San Vicente de Caguán in Caquetá department in the eastern plains.

This safe haven allowed the rebel movement to consolidate its forces and re-arm before the peace talks collapsed and fighting resumed.

Autodefensas

While former President Uribe stepped up the fight against left-wing insurgents during the first decade of the 21st century, he tried to neutralise the activities of right-wing paramilitaries through a peace agreement.

Right-wing vigilante groups began to appear in the 1980s with the declared aim of protecting the rural population from guerrilla attacks where the government was incapable of doing so.

Most of these paramilitary groups served the interests of large land owners, who were under threat from the left-wing guerrillas.

In many cases, the right-wing paramilitaries collaborated informally with the army and police.

They were responsible for thousands of extra-judicial killings.

In 1997 the right-wing paramilitaries joined forces in a loose federation called *Autodefensas Unidas de Colombia (AUC)* - the United Self Defenders of Colombia.

In 2006, Uribe arranged for the disarmament and demobilisation of 30,000 AUC members.

However, the move was only partially successful.

Many of the demobilised gunmen simply joined new armed groups serving the same political and business interests that had sponsored the AUC.

Population distribution and administration

Most of Colombia's population lives in the fertile mountains and valleys of central and western Colombia and along the Caribbean coast.

The capital Bogotá, is a city of more than eight million people, situated on a cool temperate plateau 2,600 metres above sea level. .

Thirty other cities have a population of more than 100,000.

About 75% of Colombia's population now lives in urban areas.

The climate changes in Colombia according to the altitude, often over very short distances. This allows the country to grow a wide range of crops.

The vast low-lying plains to the east of the Andes are known as *Los Llanos*.

They account for 54% of Colombia's land area, but only 3% of the population live there.

The eastern plains consist mainly of open cattle ranching country.

They have a population density of less than one person per square km.

The lowlands along the Pacific coast are densely forested and are also sparsely populated.

The Caribbean coast is more developed and has several port cities. The largest of these is Barranquilla.

Colombia is administratively divided into 32 departments (provinces) and a Federal District, in which the capital Bogota is situated.

Each department has its own elected governor and local legislature.

The departments are sub-divided into 1,102 municipalities.

National and local elections are held every four years.

The next elections are due to take place in 2014

Culture and communications

Nine out of ten Colombians can read and write and nearly everyone has a mobile phone.

Colombia has a thriving and diverse media.

Nearly all Colombians have access to radio and television.

Internet usage is widespread amongst middle class Colombians and is growing fast.

There are hundreds of local radio stations, many of which serve small and remote rural communities.

However, radio and television audiences are dominated by just three privately owned commercial networks – **RCN, Caracol Television** and **Caracol Radio**.

There are few legal constraints on press freedom, but journalists live under the constant threat of assassination if they disturb the interests of powerful and unscrupulous individuals or interest groups.

This situation has led to a degree of self-censorship when it comes to covering controversial matters such as corruption, human rights violations and drug trafficking.

Colombia possesses a good network of tarred highways, but the country's high mountain ranges make road communication very slow and time consuming.

Most cities and large towns are linked to the rest of the country by daily commercial flights.

The economy

Colombia's economy is booming thanks to strong investment in energy and mining.

The economy grew 5.9% in 2011, although the Central Bank has forecast slower growth of between 3% and 5% for 2012 and 2013.

Colombia's most valuable export is oil. The country was producing about 950,000 barrels of crude oil per day in mid-2012. Nearly half this output was shipped abroad.

Most of Colombia's oil comes from onshore wells in the eastern plains. Production is frequently disrupted by the bombing of pipelines.

Colombia is also the world's leading fourth largest coal exporter.

The massive open cast mines in the northwest of the country send coal by train to export terminals on the Caribbean coast.

Colombia produced 85.8 million tonnes of coal in 2011.

Agriculture also continues to play a major role in the economy.

Colombia is the world's third largest coffee exporter.

High quality Arabica coffee is the main cash crop of more than 500,000 small-scale farmers in the green and fertile Andean highlands.

Strong economic growth in recent years has reduced unemployment and improved living standards.

It has also created a large and affluent middle class.

However, 37% of all Colombians still lived in poverty in 2011, according to the World Bank.

The income gap between rich and poor in Colombia is still very wide, a factor which fuels social tensions.

The main cities are well endowed with urban infrastructure.

Despite high crime rates, they have remained largely immune from the fighting which has plagued vast areas of the countryside.

Media overview

Colombians get most of their news and information from television.

The most popular channels are **RCN TV** www.canalrcnmsn.com and **Caracol Television** <http://caracol.com.co>, the flagship channels of Colombia's two national commercial television networks .

Media audience surveys consistently show that these two channels are watched on a regular basis by more than 85% of all viewers.

Radio is also important, especially for local news.

Colombia had over 1,500 officially authorised radio stations in 2012, according to the Ministry of Technology, Information and Communications.

These included nearly 700 community radio stations, most of which served small towns and villages.

According to one of Colombia's most respected media audience surveys, **Estudio General de Medios (EGM)** (General Media Study), 94.4% of Colombians over the age of 12 watched television regularly in 2011.

77% said they watched television every day.

Only 64.8% listened to the radio and 34.3% read newspapers.

The annual survey of more than 12,000 media consumers in 15 towns and cities across Colombia also showed that 43.4% of Colombians used the internet.

The EGM is carried out on behalf of the Centro Colombiano de Investigacion de Medios (ACIM) www.acimcolombia.com – an association of Colombia's main media houses and advertising companies.

It records information about the consumption of all media and is compiled in phases throughout the year.

The EGM surveys show that while television and radio audiences have been fairly stable in recent years, the number of internet users has been climbing steadily.

However, the surveys also indicate clearly that internet usage is mainly restricted to middle and upper income groups.

Three privately owned commercial networks dominate broadcasting in Colombia.

RCN and **Caracol Television** control Colombia's two nationwide commercial television networks.

RCN and **Caracol Radio** www.caracol.com.co meanwhile dominate radio.

Confusingly, **Caracol Radio** is no longer under the same ownership as **Caracol Television**.

Grupo Santodomingo, Colombia's largest business conglomerate, used to own both companies. However, it sold **Caracol Radio** to Spain's **Prisa** media and publishing group in 2003.

Grupo Santodomingo continues to own **Caracol Television**.

In 2012 there were several reports in the Colombian media that Grupo Santodomingo was keen to buy back the Caracol radio business.

Newspapers are only sold and read in the main cities. They do not circulate much in rural areas.

However, many newspapers are starting to tap a much wider audience through their websites.

The most popular news website in the country is that of **El Tiempo** www.eltiempo.com, Colombia's largest and most authoritative quality daily newspaper.

According to the internet analysis website www.alexa.com, El Tiempo was the 11th most visited website in the country in November 2012.

El Tiempo's main rival, **El Espectador** www.elespectador.com was not far behind in 16th position.

Just over 40% of the population used the internet in 2011, according to the International Telecommunications Union (ITU) www.itu.int

Almost all parts of Colombia are covered by local radio and TV stations and nearly all Colombian adults have a mobile phone.

The only major gaps in the mobile network in the thinly populated eastern plains, known as *Los Llanos*, the jungles of the Pacific coast and the Amazonian forest area in the far south.

Freedom and intimidation

There are few legal constraints on media freedom.

The constitution specifically bans censorship, but libel and defamation are defined as criminal rather than civil offences.

However, harassment, intimidation and the threat of kidnap, torture and assassination have persuaded many journalists to self-censor reports on controversial issues.

Journalists have frequently been the victims of kidnapping, torture and murder by armed groups and arbitrary arrest and beatings by the government security forces.

Every year several journalists are forced to leave the region where they work because of death threats. Some have even fled abroad for fear of assassination.

According to the global press freedom watchdog Reporters Sans Frontieres (RSF) www.rsf.org, four Colombian journalists were killed in 2010 and 2011. Two of those who died were witnesses to judicial investigations into links between politicians and paramilitary groups.

RSF did not report any fatalities among journalists during the first 11 months of 2012.

However, Argemiro Cárdenas Agudelo, the manager of a community radio station in the small town of Dosquebradas in Risaraldas department was gunned down by a hired assassin in March.

Cardenas was also the director of **Red Radial Cafetera**, a network of community stations in the coffee growing region of central Colombia

The high level of intimidation and physical danger experienced by Colombian journalists caused RSF to rank the country 143rd out of the 179 countries listed in its World Press Freedom Index for 2011-12.

Media groups

The Colombian media is dominated at the national level by four large groups.

- **RCN** is Colombia's largest commercial broadcasting group. Its flagship national television channel is **RCN TV** www.canalrcnmsn.com. RCN also owns the 24-hour news channel **RTN 24**, which is broadcast by satellite and cable throughout Latin America. Its main radio network, **RCN La Radio** www.rcnradio.com, broadcasts on AM Medium Wave from 27 different cities across Colombia. RCN also owns several other radio stations aimed at specialist audiences. RCN belongs to the **Ardila Lulle** business group. Its other interests also include soft drinks, agro-industries and textiles.
- **Grupo Santodomingo** is Colombia's largest privately owned business conglomerate. It owns **Caracol Television** <http://caracoltv.com>, one of Colombia's two leading national television networks, and the **Bogotá** newspaper **El Espectador** www.elespectador.com. In 2010, the group launched a series of free sheet newspapers called **ADN** <http://diarioadn.co> in four major cities. It also owns the popular weekly magazine **Cromos**. Grupo Santodomingo formerly owned Radio Caracol. It has expressed interest in buying back the business from its current owners. In September 2012, Grupo Santodomingo gained a new foothold in radio with the launch of **Blu Radio** www.bluradio.com, a news and current affairs station.

- **Caracol Radio** www.caracol.com.co is a national radio network owned by Spain's **Prisa media** group. Its flagship radio station, **Caracol Radio**, broadcasts on FM and AM from 31 different locations across Colombia. The group also owns several other radio stations which target particular segments of the radio audience. Since 2003, Caracol Radio has been owned by **Prisa**, a Spanish media and publishing group. Prisa owns the Madrid daily newspaper **El Pais**. It has a large portfolio of media interests throughout Latin America.
- **Casa Editorial El Tiempo** www.eltiempo.com. This media group developed from the Bogota daily **El Tiempo**, Colombia's largest quality newspaper. It includes the popular Bogota television station **City TV** www.citytv.com.co, the financial daily **Portafolio** and a stable of magazines and weekly newspapers. El Tiempo was formerly controlled by the Santos family, which has long played a leading role in politics through the Liberal Party. The current head of state, President Juan Manuel Santos is a member of this family. In 2007, Spain's Planeta media and publishing group acquired a controlling 55% stake in Casa Editorial El Tiempo. But in March 2012, Planeta sold out to the Colombian billionaire banker and industrialist **Luis Carlos Sarmiento Angulo**. He subsequently bought out other minority shareholders to acquire 100% ownership of the group.

A 2009 study of urban media audiences in Colombia by Audiencescapes www.audiencescapes.org, a subsidiary of the US-based media research organisation Intermedia, found that city dwellers regarded Caracol and RCN as the two most important and reliable sources of news and information.

Colombia's third most popular television channel is the **Bogotá** commercial station **City TV** www.citytv.com.co.

According to the 2011 EGM survey, this channel, owned by **Casa Editorial El Tiempo** – the owner of **El Tiempo** newspaper - is watched regularly by more than half of all viewers in the capital.

City TV is also watched regularly by nearly a third of viewers in Colombia as a whole.

Although City TV is theoretically a local television station that only broadcasts free-to-air in the immediate vicinity of Bogotá, it is widely viewed throughout Colombia on satellite and cable.

State television

The government runs three television channels and two radio stations which broadcast nationwide.

These are controlled by the state broadcasting corporation **Radio Television Nacional de Colombia (RTVC)** www.rctv.gov.co.

RTVC's three television channels cover 94% of Colombia's national territory with their terrestrial free-to-air signal.

They are:

- **Canal Uno** www.canaluno.com.co Programming for this government-owned channel is provided by a consortium of four privately owned TV production companies. Each one supplies 32 hours of programming a week.
- **Señalcolombia** www.senalcolombia.tv This national TV channel focuses on educational and cultural programming.
- **Canal Institucional** <http://www.institucional.gov.co> This national TV channel provides information about government policy and services. It also offers a platform for political debate. Canal Institucional devotes a lot of air time to explaining the activities of public sector organisations. It often broadcasts live debates in parliament.

According to the 2011 EGM survey of television audiences, only 23% of viewers watch the RTVC channels regularly, whereas more than 85% watch **RCN TV** and **Caracol Television**.

There are also nine publicly owned regional television channels in Colombia.

Two are based in **Bogota** and two in Colombia's second largest city **Medellín**.

The others are based in **Cali**, **Manizales**, **Barranquilla** and **Bucaramanga** and the Caribbean island of **San Andres**.

Some of these channels command large audiences in the regions where they broadcast.

Cable television

Cable television is popular in Colombia and is continuing to expand.

By 2012 there were more than 3.9 million cable television subscribers in the country according to the Ministry of Technology, Information and Communications.

Besides offering subscribers a selection of Colombian and international TV channels, cable operators also provide internet connections.

There are about 40 city-based commercial cable networks.

In addition, Colombia has more than 760 Community Television cable networks.

These distribute mainstream television channels by cable within towns and villages.

Each community television network produces at least one hour per week of its own local programming. The larger community networks broadcast up to 10 hours per week.

All community television stations broadcast by cable. They are limited by law to a maximum of 15,000 subscribers.

National radio

Caracol Radio, which belongs to the Spanish media group **Prisa**, is widely regarded as having the largest national audience of any Colombian radio station.

It is perceived to be more independent and critical of the government than its main competitor, **RCN La Radio**.

RCN has a reputation of always being close to the government of the day.

Caracol Radio and **RCN** both own several secondary stations that cater for specific segments of the national radio audience.

Some of these have extensive nationwide coverage and offer regional variations in programming.

Others only broadcast from two or three selected locations.

Many of the Caracol and RCN niche stations broadcast on both FM and AM Medium Wave.

This enables them to capture both urban and rural audiences since the Medium Wave signal carries further into the countryside.

The Caracol portfolio of niche radio stations consists of:

- **W Radio** – a popular news and music station that plays Golden Oldies
- **Radioactiva** – an international rock music station aimed at young people.
- **Tropicana** – a Latin American music station
- **Besame** – which plays romantic mood music
- **Oxigeno** – A light entertainment and music station aimed at a youth audience
- **Radio Recuerdos** – a station that plays traditional Colombian music
- **Los 40 Principales** - a pop music and light entertainment station for youth. It broadcasts throughout Latin America
- **Colorin Coloradio** – which carries programmes for children
- **HJCK** – This cultural station plays jazz, blues and classical music. It now only broadcasts on the internet

RCN offers:

- **La FM** – a popular news, sports and music station
- **La Mega** – which carries entertainment programming
- **Rumba** – A Latin American popular music station
- **Radio Uno** – A youth music and entertainment station
- **Antena 2** – A sports station, with an emphasis on football and cycling
- **Fantástica** – A music and entertainment station on air in Bogota and Medellin
- **La Cariñosa** – A Medium Wave music and entertainment station
- **Amor** – A music station that deals with love, sex and matters of the heart. It broadcasts in Bogota and Medellin
- **El Sol** – A station that plays salsa music

The influence of RCN and Caracol also extends to many smaller, nominally independent provincial radio stations. Many of these lease air time to the big national networks.

The state broadcasting corporation **RCTV** operates two national radio networks:

- **Radio Nacional de Colombia** www.radionacionaldecolombia.gov.co is the government's flagship national radio station. It carries a lot of news and current affairs programming, interspersed with music and drama. Radio Nacional de Colombia broadcasts on FM and AM Medium Wave in 36 locations across the country. Many of these are remote and isolated communities.
- **Radionica** www.radionica.gov.co is a popular music station with regular news bulletins. It broadcasts on FM in seven large cities.

In addition, the army and police operate separate networks of local radio stations, mainly in rural areas.

The army radio network, **Emisora del Ejército** www.emisoraejercito.mil.co operated 97 local stations in late 2012, mostly in areas of conflict.

The police radio network, **Radio Policía Nacional** www.policia.gov.co, operated 28 local stations, many of them in remote parts of the country.

Community radio

There were also nearly 700 community radio stations on air in late 2012, according to the Ministry of Technology, Information and Communication.

These stations provide local news and information and educational programming and encourage listeners to air their views on issues relevant to their daily lives.

Some are owned by municipal authorities, others by local associations, churches, colleges and universities.

There are 29 community radio stations which cater specifically for indigenous ethnic groups. These stations are known collectively as ***Radio Indigena***.

The government's declared aim is to have a community radio station broadcasting in each of the country's 1,102 municipalities.

Community radio stations are supported by a series of regional associations and specialist NGOs.

These include the Canadian-funded **Sistema de Comunicacion para la Paz (SIPAZ)**. It works with more than 40 local radio stations to promote peace in areas of Colombia affected by conflict.

The Roman Catholic Church operates more than 50 local radio stations across the country.

Several of its large city-based stations are coordinated through the **Minuto de Dios** www.radiominutodedios.com national radio network.

Many community stations struggle to raise enough revenue to cover their operating costs.

Their editorial independence is often compromised by political pressures from local politicians and armed factions operating in the neighbourhood.

Journalists working for community radio stations are particularly exposed to threats and harassment.

Newspapers

Very few newspapers circulate outside the main towns.

However, through their websites Colombian newspapers have attracted a large and growing online readership.

Several daily newspapers published in Bogota consider themselves to be national in character.

Although most of their sales are in the capital, they are also available in Colombia's other main cities.

There are several regional dailies, published in the country's main provincial cities.

Most of them do not have a large circulation, but many regional newspapers are influential amongst local decision makers

Nearly all Colombian newspapers have long-standing links with one of the country's two main political parties; the Liberals and the Conservatives.

The country's largest and most influential quality newspaper is the Bogota daily **El Tiempo** www.eltiempo.com.

It had a daily circulation of more than 300,000 in 2010 and claimed to have more than 1.1 million daily readers.

El Tiempo was formerly controlled by the Santos family – a major player in Liberal politics.

The Santos family surrendered control of the newspaper and its other media assets in 2007 by selling a 55% controlling stake in **Casa Editorial El Tiempo** to Spain's Planeta media and publishing group.

In March 2012, Planeta sold out to the Colombian billionaire banker and industrialist **Luis Carlos Sarmiento Angulo**. He subsequently bought out all the group's other shareholders.

Colombia's other leading quality newspaper is the Bogota daily **El Espectador** www.elespectador.com.

This is also pro-Liberal, but has a much smaller circulation.

A financial crisis forced El Espectador to abandon daily publication between 2001 and 2008. During this period it became a weekly.

El Espectador now appears daily again. The printed edition of the paper had about 250,000 readers in 2012, according to the EGM media survey, although its print run would have been much lower.

Three new large circulation dailies have hit the streets in recent years to cater for readers at the lower end of the market.

Q'Hubo (What's Up) www.ghubo.com is a popular tabloid that focuses on human interest stories told in plain language.

It produces several regional editions that are printed locally in different parts of the country.

Q'Hubo circulates in all the most intensively populated parts of highland Colombia and the Caribbean coast. It claimed 2.2 million readers in 2012.

Q'Hubo was launched in 2005 by **Grupo Nacional de Medios (GNM)**, a consortium of regional daily newspapers

The other big newcomer is the free sheet **ADN** <http://diarioadn.co>.

This newspaper, launched by **Casa Editorial El Tiempo** in 2009, distributes four separate city editions in **Bogota Cali Medellin** and **Barranquilla**.

In 2012 ADN claimed nearly 1.3 million readers.

On the Caribbean coast, another free sheet, **Al Dia**, has also developed a strong readership since its launch in 2007. This is an offshoot from the long-established Barranquilla daily **El Herald**.

El Espacio www.elespacio.com.co is a popular down-market tabloid, published in **Bogotá**, has seen its circulation fall in response to this new competition.

Influential regional dailies include the following:

- **El Colombiano** www.elcolombiano.com.co – a conservative daily newspaper in **Medellín**.
- **El Mundo** www.elmundo.com.co – a Liberal daily published in **Medellín**.
- **El País** www.elpais.com.co – a Conservative daily published in **Cali**.
- **El Herald** www.elheraldo.com.co – a Liberal newspaper published in **Barranquilla**. It is the most influential newspaper on the Caribbean coast.
- **Vanguardia Liberal** www.vanguardia.com – a Liberal daily published in **Bucaramanga** which is influential in Santander department
- **La Opinion** www.laopinion.com.co - a daily newspaper published in **Cucuta** near the Venezuelan frontier
- **La Patria** www.lapatria.com – a Conservative daily published in **Manizales**, the centre of Colombia's main coffee growing area
- **Llano 7 dias** – A daily newspaper published in **Villavicencio**, the gateway to Colombia's eastern plains

The most widely read news and current affairs magazine is **La Semana** www.semana.com.

It claims to be read by more than one million Colombians every month.

Another popular weekly magazine is **Cromos** www.cromos.com.co, which belongs to **Grupo Santodomingo**.

Cromos is more focussed on lifestyle issues, fashion, celebrities and entertainment than news and current affairs.

Media regulation

Radio broadcasting is regulated by the Ministry of Information Technology and Communications www.mintic.gov.co.

The ministry issues and renews radio licences, monitors broadcast output and investigates complaints about radio stations by members of the public.

Television is regulated by an independent body called the National Television Authority - **La Autoridad Nacional de Televisión (ANTV)** www.antv.gov.co

This began operations in April 2012.

It replaced a similar organisation called the National Television Commission – *La Comisión Nacional de Televisión (CNTV)*.

No government licence is required to publish a newspaper or magazine.

No licence is required either to work as a journalist.

Radio overview

Radio remains an important source of news and information across Colombia, even though more people now watch television.

According to the Ministry of Information Technology and Communications www.mintic.gov.co there were 1,536 registered radio stations in Colombia in November 2012.

A full list of all authorised radio stations is available on page www.mintic.gov.co/index.php/radio-difusion-sonora of the ministry's website. Click on the link "*Listado de emisoras*" at the bottom of this page.

One of Colombia's most respected media audience surveys, **Estudio General de Medios (EGM)** (General Media Study), found that 64.8% of the population over the age of 12 listened to radio regularly in 2011.

However, the EGM and Colombia's main survey of radio listening habits, the **Estudio Continuo de Audiencias de Radio (ECAR)** (Continuous Study of Radio Audiences), only measure media consumption patterns in the urban population.

This is understandable since three quarters of Colombians now live in towns and cities.

However conflict and natural disasters frequently strike harder at the rural population, whose media consumption patterns may well be different.

It is likely that in rural areas, there is often less access to television and a greater reliance on radio than in the towns.

Colombian radio stations mostly broadcast on FM to urban audiences.

However, they often use AM Medium Wave to reach listeners in more distant rural areas.

Some radio stations targeting older listeners also broadcast on AM rather than FM

Many radio stations broadcast on both wave bands in order to capture urban and rural audiences.

The peak time for radio listening is in the morning between 07.00 and 10.00. About 40% of Colombians tune in at some point during this three-hour period.

In the evening, most people watch television instead.

Radio is dominated by two huge commercial networks

- **Caracol Radio** www.caracol.com.co is a radio broadcasting group owned by Spain's **Prisa** media group. Its flagship national station **Caracol Radio** broadcasts on FM and AM from 31 different locations across Colombia. It is Colombia's most listened to radio station.
- **RCN** www.rcnradio.com is Colombia's largest commercial broadcasting group. Its flagship radio station **RCN La Radio** broadcasts on AM Medium Wave from 27 cities across Colombia. RCN is also one of the two main players in Colombian television. It belongs to the privately owned **Ardila Lulle** business conglomerate.

Caracol Radio and RCN La Radio are the most widely listened to radio stations in the country.

However, media audience surveys show that Caracol tends to be regarded as more independent and critical and is therefore more widely trusted.

RCN is generally perceived as being too close to the government of the day.

Each broadcasting network owns a stable of secondary radio stations that cater for niche audiences.

Many of these have broad national coverage and offer regional variations in programming.

Some only broadcast in two or three of the country's main cities

It is important to note that Caracol Radio no longer forms part of the same media group as its TV counterpart **Caracol Television**.

Both formerly belonged to Grupo Santodomingo, Colombia's largest privately owned business conglomerate.

However, Grupo Santodomingo sold the radio division of Caracol to Prisa in 2003.

It continues to own Caracol Television.

Several media reports in 2012 suggested that Grupo Santodomingo was keen to buy back Caracol Radio.

The conglomerate has already taken some steps to regain a foothold in radio.

It launched a news and current affairs station in **Bogota** called **Blu Radio** www.bluradio.com in September 2012.

The Caracol Radio portfolio of secondary radio stations consists of:

- **W Radio** www.wradio.com.co – a popular nationwide news, sports and music station that plays Golden Oldies
- **Tropicana** www.tropicanafm.com – This station broadcasts popular Colombian music in 25 cities around the country
- **Radioactiva** www.radioactiva.com – a station that plays international rock music . It is mainly aimed young people.
- **Bésame** www.besamefm –a station that plays romantic mood music and classic hits from the 1980s. It is aimed at a female adult audience.
- **Oxígeno** www.oxigeno.fm – A light entertainment and music station aimed at a youth audience
- **Radio Recuerdos** – This Medium Wave station plays traditional Colombian music for the older generation
- **Los 40 Principales** www.los40.com.co - a pop music and light entertainment station for youth that broadcasts throughout Latin America
- **Colorín Coloradio** www.colorincolorradio.com a radio station for children
- **HJCK** www.hjck.com – This cultural station plays jazz, blues, son cubano and classical music. Since 2005, it only broadcasts over the internet

RCN's second tier radio stations include:

- **La FM** www.lafm.com.co – a popular news, sports and music station that broadcasts on FM in 10 cities across the country
- **La Mega** www.lamega.com.co – A music and light entertainment station that broadcasts on FM in 16 cities
- **Radio Uno** www.radio1.com.co – A youth music and entertainment station that broadcasts on FM in 25 towns and cities
- **Rumba** www.rumba.com.co – A Latin American popular music station broadcasting on FM in 19 cities
- **Antena 2** www.antena2.com.co – A sports station, with an emphasis on football and cycling. It broadcasts nationwide on Medium Wave
- **Fantástica** www.fantastica.com.co – A popular music station broadcasting on FM in Bogota and Medellin

- **La Cariñosa'** www.xn--lacariosa-q6a.com – A Medium Wave music and entertainment station
- **Amor** www.amores.com.co – A music station that deals with love, sex and matters of the heart. It broadcasts in Bogota and Medellin
- **El Sol** www.elsol.com.co – An FM station that plays popular Latin American music in Medellin, Cali and Tuluá in western Colombia

RCN and Caracol Radio programming is also carried by many small and nominally independent provincial radio station which lease air time to the big national networks.

Government radio stations

The state broadcasting corporation **RTVC** www.rtv.gov.co operates two national radio networks:

- **Radio Nacional de Colombia** www.radionacionaldecolombia.gov.co is the government's flagship national radio station. It carries a lot of news and current affairs programming, interspersed with music and drama. Radio Nacional de Colombia broadcasts on FM and AM Medium Wave in 36 locations around the country. It serves many remote communities which the national commercial networks fail to reach.
- **Radionica** www.radionica.gov.co is an FM popular music station with regular news bulletins. It broadcasts in seven large cities.

In addition, the army and police operate more than 120 radio stations.

The army radio network is called **Emisora del Ejército** www.emisoraejercito.mil.co. Its central studios in Bogota produce national programming which is relayed by the network's 97 local radio stations across Colombia.

These small stations also produce some local output. Most are situated in zones of conflict with the FARC and ELN rebel movements.

The police radio network **Radio Policía Nacional** [www.policia.gov.co/portal/page/portal/Noticias_y_Documentacion/Medios Comunicacion Institucionales/Emisoras/emisora Bogota92.4fm](http://www.policia.gov.co/portal/page/portal/Noticias_y_Documentacion/Medios_Comunicacion_Institucionales/Emisoras/emisora_Bogota92.4fm) operates 28 FM stations in various provincial capitals across the country.

Public sector broadcasters are obliged to provide educational and cultural programming and to promote civic values.

Religious networks

Colombia has two national networks of Christian religious radio stations.

The Roman Catholic Church runs more than 50 radio stations in Colombia. Many of them are small community stations serving remote settlements.

The Catholic **Minuto de Dios** www.radiominutodedios.com network runs city-based FM stations in **Bogotá, Cartagena, Barranquilla** and **Medellin**.

Colmundo <http://colmundoradio.com.co> is a separate Christian-inspired network of 10 Medium Wave radio stations around Colombia.

It targets people over the age of 30.

Colmundo does not broadcast overtly religious programming and does not have formal links to any particular church.

The benchmark radio audience survey in Colombia is **ECAR**, which is produced by the Centro Nacional de Consultoria www.centronacionaldeconsultoria.com.

Its findings are based on a daily telephone survey of radio listeners in 18 cities across the country.

However the ECAR findings are not made public and can only be obtained on a paid for basis.

Data from the EGM all-media audience survey produced for the Centro Colombiano de Investigacion de Medios (ACIM) www.acimcolombia.com – an association of Colombia's main media houses and advertising companies – is often made publicly available on a piecemeal basis.

The EGM uses a sample of more than 12,000 people to look at media consumption habits in 15 cities across Colombia. It is compiled in phases throughout the year.

Community radio

There were nearly 700 officially authorised community radio stations on air in late 2012, according to the Ministry of Information Technology and Communication.

A full list of community radio stations can be found on the ministry's website at www.mintic.gov.co/index.php/radio-difusion-sonora. Click on the link "*Listado de emisoras*" at the bottom of the page.

A list of community radio stations by department can also be found in annex I of this guide.

Community stations provide local news and information and educational programming.

They also encourage listeners to air their views on issues relevant to their daily lives.

Some are owned by municipal authorities, others by local associations, churches, schools, colleges and universities.

The government's declared aim is to have a community radio station broadcasting in each of the country's 1,102 municipalities.

Most community stations broadcast for between 18 and 20 hours a day.

They start at 04.00 or 0.500 in the morning and remain on air continuously until 22.00 or 23.00 at night

Some close down for a lunchtime break at midday.

The most popular programmes are broadcast during the morning peak listening period.

All community stations play a lot of popular music.

They also broadcast a lot of programming aimed at communicating with particular groups, such as internally displaced people.

Much of their educational and social outreach programming is produced and broadcast in partnership with government departments and NGOs.

There are several regional associations of community radio stations, but no single organisation represents their interests at a national level.

One of the most active regional associations is the **Asociación Red de Emisoras Comunitarias del Magdalena Medio (AREDMAG)** –The Network Association of Community Channels of the Middle Magdalena.

This groups 18 community stations in the departments of Antioquia, Cesar, Bolívar and Santander - all places badly affected by the activities of left-wing guerrilla and right-wing paramilitary groups.

AREDMAG has developed a Rural Reporters' Network where community leaders become journalists who present the most crucial issues facing their community.

The network produces a networked lunchtime news bulletin and common programming on a number of social issues.

Since 1999, 29 radio stations serving indigenous ethnic communities have been opened with government encouragement.

These are known as **Radios Indigenas**.

Each one produces programming tailored to the interests of the ethnic community. The radios indigenas mostly broadcast in traditional languages of the communities they serve rather than Spanish.

Today Radios Indigenas exist in the departments of Tolima, Caldas, Antioquia, Cordoba, Cauca, Valle del Cauca, Narino, Putumayo and Caqueta.

However, a review conducted by the government in 2010 suggested that the radios indigenas were being run as a top-down operation and were out of touch with many of the issues that most concerned their target audience.

It noted that there was little evidence to show how much indigenous people actually listened to these stations.

Since 2004, the government has promoted the discussion of several major themes of national concern on community radio stations through the UNDP-backed **Radios Ciudadanas** – Citizen Radios - project.

This aims to coordinate programmes on the same theme which are broadcast at the same time by community stations across the country.

Themes tackled in this way by Radios Ciudadanas include forced displacement, good governance, peaceful co-existence, gender-based violence and environmental protection.

Another community radio initiative is the Canadian-funded **Sistema de Comunicación para la Paz (SIPAZ)** - System of Peace Communication.

This project works with more than 40 local radio stations to promote peace in areas of Colombia affected by conflict.

SIPAZ does not report directly on conflict, but it does promote discussion of its consequences on the air waves. It also emphasises the positive action taken by local communities to rebuild their lives.

For example, in Belén de los Andaquíes — the only municipality in the eastern department of Caquetá whose economy is not based on cocaine cultivation — the creation of a community radio station helped to reinforced Belén's identity as a municipality committed to planting food crops rather than cocaine.

The SIPAZ-supported station in Belén has been the target of guerrilla attacks, but its children's radio school was awarded UNICEF's prize for Children's Programming in Latin America.

The editorial independence of community radio stations is often compromised by political pressures.

Community radio stations are heavily dependent on revenue from government advertising and this makes them vulnerable to political interference in their editorial policy.

Many community stations are also vulnerable to more sinister pressures from local politicians and armed factions operating in the neighbourhood.

In February and March 2011, right-wing paramilitary groups in western Colombia circulated leaflets in the city of Popayan issuing death threats against 11 journalists working for the local media. The leaflets also named 11 community radio stations affiliated to Cauca Regional Indigenous Council (CRIC) as targets for future attack.

In March 2012, Argemiro Cárdenas Agudelo, the manager of Metro Radio Estéreo, a community radio station in the small town of Dosquebradas in Risaraldas department, was gunned down by a hired assassin.

Cárdenas was also the director of **Red Radial Cafetera**, a network of community stations in the coffee growing region of central Colombia.

His killer was caught, tried and jailed, but his paymasters were never publicly identified or prosecuted.

Radio regulation

The Ministry of Information Technology and Communication awards and extends radio licenses, monitors broadcast output and deals with complaints about radio programming from members of the public.

Radio stations are permitted to broadcast up to 15 minutes of advertising per hour.

They are also allowed to sell air time to third party programme providers.

It is common practice for small radio stations to rent out air time on their frequencies to national radio channels keen to extend the geographic reach of their most popular programmes.

Community radio is heavily encouraged in a deliberate attempt to counteract RCN and Caracol Radio's domination of national broadcasting with locally owned and managed radio stations that encourage local content and citizen participation.

The government has awarded more than 840 licences to community radio stations since the early 1990s.

A 2010 UNESCO report noted that licensees pay a one-off fee for the frequency they are allocated, ranging from US\$900 to \$2000 and an annual licence fee of about \$150 thereafter.

Radio networks

Caracol Radio (network) www.caracol.com.co

Caracol Radio is the most listened to radio network in Colombia, according to the country's leading radio audience survey.

The **Estudio Continuo de Audiencias de Radio (ECAR)** (Continuous Study of Radio Audiences) consistently shows Caracol ahead of its main rival **RCN**.

Caracol means "snail" in Spanish, but the name of the radio network is actually an acronym for *Cadena Radial Colombiana* – the Colombian Radio Network.

Caracol Radio is owned by the Spanish media and publishing group **Prisa**.

Prisa acquired full control of the business from **Grupo Santodomingo**, Colombia's largest privately owned business conglomerate, in 2003 after purchasing a minority stake in 1999.

In 2012 there were several reports in the Colombian media that Grupo Santodomingo was keen to buy back the radio network.

Grupo Santodomingo still owns **Caracol Television**, one of Colombia's two largest television networks.

Caracol Radio is widely seen as being more independent and critical in its news reporting than RCN. It is therefore more trusted as a source of news and information.

An Audiencescapes www.audiencescapes.org survey of the Colombian urban media in 2009 showed that Caracol Radio was regarded as trustworthy by 25% of respondents, whereas, RCN La Radio was only trusted by 21%.

Caracol Radio is based in Bogota, but has content-producing radio studios in all the country's main cities.

Its flagship station, **Caracol Radio**, broadcasts from 31 cities across Colombia on both FM and AM Medium Wave.

In addition, the group operates eight other radio stations that target particular segments of the population.

Several of these stations have a broad national reach.

Some of Caracol Radio's entertainment stations, such as **La W**, **Bésame** and **Los 40 Principales**, are local variants of international radio networks owned by Prisa.

These operate in several Latin American countries.

In 2007 Caracol worked with UNHCR to transmit humanitarian messages to internally displaced people (IDPs).

Its local stations in several cities that usually played popular music programmes and soap operas, were used to broadcast messages to IDPs about their entitlements under Colombian law, as well as practical information about how and where to register and receive assistance.

The main radio stations of Caracol Radio are described in detail below.

Caracol Radio (station) www.caracol.com.co

Caracol Radio is a national talk radio station which focuses on news, current affairs, sport and entertainment.

It is the flagship station of the Caracol Radio network.

Caracol Radio commands a larger audience than any other radio station in Colombia according to the **Estudio Continuo de Audiencias de Radio (ECAR)** (Continuous Study of Radio Audiences).

It broadcasts on FM and AM Medium Wave from 31 cities across Colombia, on satellite and online.

Caracol Radio's morning news and current affairs magazine programme *Hoy por Hoy* (The Day Today) is Colombia's most widely listened to radio programme, according to ECAR and another benchmark media survey **Estudio General de Medios (EGM)**.

It is on air Monday to Friday from 04.00 to 10.00.

Local Caracol stations opt out of the programme to broadcast 10-minute bulletins of local and regional news at 05.20, 06.20 and 07.20.

Another 60-minute midday news programme *Hora de Mediodía* goes out at 12.00.

The main evening news and current affairs programme *Hora 20.00* is a two-hour show which starts at 19.00.

Like its main competitor, Caracol Radio, RCN runs a national flagship station and a portfolio of secondary stations aimed at niche sectors of the radio audience.

RCN is owned by the **Adila Lulle** group, one of Colombia's largest privately owned business conglomerates. It grew out of a soft drinks bottling company in Cali.

RCN, which stands for *Radio Cadena Nacional* (National Radio Chain), also owns one of Colombia's two largest commercial television networks..

Its media outlets are generally regarded as taking a more pro-government line than those of Caracol Radio and Caracol Television.

An Audiencescapes www.audiencescapes.org survey of the Colombian urban media in 2009 showed that Caracol Radio was regarded as trustworthy by 25% of respondents, whereas, RCN La Radio was only trusted by 21%.

RCN's national flagship radio station is called **RCN La Radio**. It broadcasts on AM Medium Wave from studios in 27 cities across Colombia.

The group also operates several other radio stations that target niche audiences.

These have varying degrees of national coverage.

La FM, a talk station, and **La Mega**, a music and entertainment station, are the largest and most popular.

It opens the lines to anyone, particularly to those who have left violence behind who call in to tell their own stories.

La Noche de la Libertad (The Night of Freedom) is a late night programme on Sundays and Mondays that reaches out to those who have been kidnapped and their families. It includes a special phone-in for people to send messages to those who are held in the bush.

Television overview

Television is the main source of news, information and entertainment for Colombians in both urban and rural areas.

More than 94% of Colombians watch television regularly, according to the 2011 media audience survey **Estudio General de Medios (EGM)** www.slideshare.net/prensanet/egm-2011-3ola#btnNext.

This survey of 12,000 people in 15 towns and cities found that 77.2% of respondents watched television every day.

A further 15.3% watched TV on least five days each week.

Television viewing is dominated by just two national commercial channels:

- **RCN TV** www.canalrcnmsn.com
- **Caracol Television** www.canalrcnmsn.com.

Both offer a broad range of news, sport and family entertainment programming.

Their soap operas, known as *telenovelas*, are particularly popular.

The EGM survey found that 96.6% of viewers watched RCN TV and Caracol Television regularly.

RCN TV was slightly ahead in the ratings.

89.7% of viewers said they had watched the channel in the previous month and 71.4% on the previous day.

The EGM survey found that 85.0% of viewers had watched Caracol Television in the previous month and 63.4% had watched it in the previous 24 hours.

The government has talked for several years about licensing a third national commercial TV channel to break the RCN/Caracol duopoly. However, as of December 2012 no new national licence had been issued

The closest challenger to the RCN TV and Caracol Television is the **Bogotá** commercial television channel **City TV** www.citytv.com.co.

According to the 2011 EGM survey, City TV is watched regularly by 56.5% of viewers in the capital, which has a population of over seven million.

City TV's audience figures in the rest of the country are lower, but it is still the third most popular channel in the whole of Colombia.

Just over 30% of television viewers nationwide watch City TV regularly, according to the EGM.

City TV belongs to **Casa Editorial El Tiempo**, the owners of **El Tiempo** newspaper, Most television viewing takes place at home in the evening.

94% of respondents to the EGM survey said they watched television at night.

From Monday to Friday there is a secondary peak in television audiences at lunchtime.

This secondary peak moves to the afternoon at weekends.

During the early morning, all the main TV channels carry breakfast news and current affairs shows, but at that time of day many people prefer to listen to radio instead.

Cable and satellite TV

Most Colombians watch free-to-air terrestrial broadcasts, but cable and satellite television are growing fast in popularity.

By 2012 there were more than 3.9 million cable television subscribers in the country according to the Ministry of Information Technology and Communications www.mintic.gov.co.

Besides offering a selection of Colombian and international TV channels, cable operators also provide internet connections.

There are about 40 city-based commercial cable networks.

In addition, Colombia has more than 760 Community Television cable networks.

These transmit a selection of up to seven mainstream television channels by cable to individual households in small towns and villages.

Every community cable network is legally obliged to produce and broadcast between one and 10 hours per week of its own local programming each week.

However, these not-for-profit organisations are limited to a maximum of 15,000 subscribers.

The 2011 EGM survey showed that the most popular foreign TV channels on commercial pay-TV networks were **Discovery Channel**, **TNT**, **Animal Planet** and **Fox TV**.

State television

The state broadcasting corporation **Radio Television de Colombia (RTCV)** www.radionacionaldecolombia.gov.co broadcasts three national channels.

All of them have a strong focus on news and information and educational and cultural programming.

However, the RTVC channels are only watched by a small minority of viewers.

Canal Uno and **Señalcolombia** are the most popular RTVC channels.

The 2011 EGM survey showed that one in 10 viewers had watched these two channels in the previous month.

Canal Uno www.canaluno.com.co broadcasts a varied mix of news, sport, educational and entertainment programming.

This is provided by a consortium of four privately owned TV production companies. Each one provides 32 hours of programming a week.

Señalcolombia www.senalcolombia.tv offers a broad range of educational and cultural programming provided directly by its own staff. It broadcasts a lot of films and documentaries.

RTVC's third channel, **Canal Institucional** <http://www.institucional.gov.co> provides information about government departments and agencies and the services which they offer. It also provides a platform for political debate.

It often broadcasts live debates in parliament.

However, the rather dry content of Canal Institucional has limited public appeal.

According to the EGM survey, fewer than one in 20 Colombians bother to watch it.

Regional public TV channels

There are nine state-owned regional channels.

These have a much stronger appeal than the RTVC national channels in the areas where they broadcast.

The 2011 EGM survey found that on average they were watched by about 15% of television viewers.

The regional channels are mostly controlled by the provincial governments of the departments that they serve. They carry a lot of regional news and information.

The regional channels are:

- **Canal 13** www.canal13.com.co This channel is based in **Bogota**. It produces entertainment programming for a youth audience in eastern Colombia. The channel is majority owned by the Ministry of Technology, Information and Communication.
- **Canal Capital** www.canalcapital.gov.co This television station serves the city of **Bogotá**. It is run by the municipal authority.
- **Teleantioquia** www.teleantioquia.com.co is a regional television channel based in **Medellin**. It serves the department of Antioquia. The station focuses on regional news and current affairs and also carries entertainment programming.
- **Telemedellín** www.telemedellin.tv is a local station serving **Medellín**, Colombia's second largest city. It is owned by the **Medellín** city authority.
- **Telecaribe** www.telecaribe.com.co is a government-run regional television channel serving the Caribbean coastal region. It is based in **Barranquilla** and is controlled by the provincial governments Atlántico, Cesar, Córdoba, Sucre, Magdalena and Guajira.
- **Telepacífico**. www.telepacifico.com is a government-run regional television station serving western Colombia. It is based in **Cali**. It carries four programmes of regional news per day and a range of educational and cultural programming. Its 19 transmitters cover the main towns in the departments of Valle del Cauca, Cauca, Chocó and Nariño.
- **Canal TRO** www.canaltro.com is a government-run regional television station serving the northeastern departments of Santander and Norte de Santander. It has studios in **Bucaramanga** and **Cúcuta**
- **Telecafé** www.telecafe.tv is a regional television channel serving the main coffee-growing region of central Colombia. It is based in **Manizales** and has studios in **Armenia** and **Pereira**. Telecafé covers the departments of Caldas, Quindío and Risaralda.
- **Teleislas** www.teleislas.com.co This small television station broadcasts to the Caribbean islands of **San Andres** and **Providencia**. Traditionally the people of these islands spoke English rather than Spanish. The islands are a duty-free zone. The government has been promoting them for many years as a tourism destination.

In addition there are more than 40 local television channels run by a variety of not-for-profit organisations.

These broadcast free-to-air from terrestrial transmitters, but they tend to command very small niche audiences.

Community television

Colombia had 763 community television networks in April 2012, according to the **Autoridad Nacional de Televisión (ANTA)** www.antv.gov.co, the government authority which licences and regulates television.

These not-for-profit associations are allowed to distribute up to seven mainstream national and regional television channels by cable to a maximum of 15,000 subscribers.

Community cable networks often provide the only means by which local people can see mainstream TV channels in media-dark areas which Colombia's free-to-air terrestrial transmitters fail to reach.

However, the community TV associations are not just cable distributors of third party programming.

Each one is legally obliged to produce and broadcast a few hours of its own programming each week.

Community television stations have an official remit to produce programming that satisfies the community's educational, recreational and cultural needs.

They are also charged with promoting the rights and responsibilities of individual citizens and encouraging their participation in society.

Community TV stations are not allowed to broadcast religious or politically motivated programming or place programmes from other TV licence holders on their own channel.

Those with fewer than 2,000 subscribers are legally obliged to produce and broadcast at least one hour of original programming per week.

Community stations with 2,000 to 8,000 subscribers have to broadcast at least two hours of original programming per week, plus an additional half hour for each third party channel that they distribute.

Community stations with more than 8,000 subscribers have to produce a minimum of two hours of original programming per week, plus an extra hour for every additional 1,000 subscribers and an extra half hour for each encoded channel distributed.

A list of community TV networks by department is also published in Annex II of this guide.

Community TV stations are allowed to sell advertising within their own broadcast programming.

However, they may not insert advertising to the programming of other channels that they relay.

People working within the community television sector would like to see the licensing conditions made more flexible.

In particular, they would like the ceiling of 15,000 subscribers per network raised so that community stations could serve larger population groups.

Community TV activists would also like individual stations to be able to share their own programming output with neighbouring community stations more easily.

The most common programme formats on community television are local news bulletins and magazine programmes and live broadcasts of sporting fixtures and cultural events.

Community TV stations are seen as an information lifeline in many communities plagued by drug trafficking and paramilitary activity.

They generally avoid commenting on or documenting acts of violence, but they do address these issues indirectly.

TVO Bien, a community station on the outskirts of **Medellin**, for example, produces television dramas about the waves of displaced people fleeing to the city to escape conflict in the countryside.

The Community Television Multiactive Cooperative - **Cooperativa multiactiva de televisión comunitaria (COMUtv)** www.comutv.org – is an organisation that represents and supports community television networks in Colombia.

It is based in **Medellin** and has more than 100 member community TV networks across the country.

COMUtv buys equipment in bulk on behalf of its members and provides them with technical support.

It also negotiates deals with the television channels that are relayed by community cable networks.

The association promotes joint programme productions between different community TV networks and the distribution of these programmes to other community stations.

Another lobby group for the community television sector is the **Consejo Nacional de Televisión Comunitaria** <http://consejonacionalcolombiacntc.blogspot.co.uk>

This brings together six regional community television associations.

RCN TV is Colombia's most popular television channel.

It broadcasts a wide range of news, sport and family entertainment and claims to reach 97% of the country's population.

According to the **Estudio General de Medios (EGM)** 2011 media survey, RCN TV was regularly watched by 89.5% of Colombian television viewers

Its overall share of the national television audience was 27.0%, just ahead of its main rival **Caracol Television**, on 25.1%.

RCN TV, which has a companion radio network, is owned by **Ardila Lulle** group, one of Colombia's largest privately owned business conglomerates. The Arlia Lulle grew out of a soft drinks bottling firm in Cali.

RCN media outlets have a reputation for being more pro-government than those of Caracol, which are widely perceived as being more critical and independent.

RCN TV is based in **Bogotá**. It has been on air continuously since 1976.

It carries daily news programmes at 06.30, 12.30, 19.00 and 23.00.

The channel has a track record of collaborating with Colombian and international aid agencies at times of humanitarian crisis, particularly with the Red Cross.

RCN journalists are trained to report from hostile environments. This helps them to to operate in areas of Colombia affected by the left-wing guerrilla insurgency and drug cultivation and smuggling.

In addition to its flagship national channel RCN TV, RCN owns several specialist channels which are broadcast by cable and satellite. These include:

- **Nuestra Tele Noticias 24 Horas (NTN24)** www.ntn24.com, an international news channel called which broadcasts by satellite and cable throughout Latin America and North America.
- **RCN Nuestra Tele** www.rcnnuestratele.co, an international satellite and cable channel with mixed programming. It is also known as **TV Colombia**. It is available in several Latin American countries, the United States, Canada and Spain.

- **RCN Telenovelas** www.rcntelenovelas.com.co, a pay-TV satellite and cable channel that shows non-stop soap operas. RCN said it had 800,000 subscribers in 2012.

Caracol Television www.caracoltv.com

Caracol Television is one of the two most popular televisión channels in Colombia.

This privately-owned commercial TV channel broadcasts a varied diet of news, sports and family entertainment. The latter includes soap operas, known as *telenovelas*, and children's programmes

Caracol Television broadcasts round the clock from studios in **Bogota**. It does not offer any regional variations in programming.

In recent years Caracol has commanded slightly lower televisión audiences than its main competitor **RCN TV**.

Caracol Television said in its 2012 annual report that it achieved a 25.1% share of the national TV audience in 2011, not far behind RCN TV, which led with 27.0%.

The **Estudio General de Medios (EGM)** media audience survey found that Caracol Television was regularly watched by 85.0% of all televisión viewers in 2011.

Caracol Television broadcasts free-to-air from 135 terrestrial transmitters that cover most of Colombia. It also broadcasts to the entire country by satellite via Intelsat 9.

The company is owned by Grupo Santodomingo, one of Colombia's largest privately owned business conglomerates. It is controlled by the Santo Domingo family, one of the world's richest families.

Grupo Santodomingo's other media assets include the Bogota daily newspaper **El Espectador**, the daily free sheet **ADN**, the weekly magazine **Cromos** and **Blu Radio**, a news and current affairs radio station launched in September 2012.

The conglomerate formerly owned **Caracol Radio** as well, but it sold this leading radio network to the Spanish media group **Prisa** in 2003.

Grupo Domingo and Prisa signed an agreement that allows both companies to use the Caracol brand name for broadcasting.

Caracol Television is one of Colombia's oldest TV channels. It has been on air continuously since 1954.

The main news programmes are broadcast at 06.30 in the morning and 19.00 in the evening.

The morning news show *Noticias Caracol* is a 105-minute magazine programme that claims the highest ratings of all shows on Colombian morning televisión.

The evening edition of *Noticias Caracol* lasts 60 minutes

Caracol broadcasts a weekly investigative journalism programme called *Séptimo Día* (Seventh Day) on Sundays at 20.00. This looks into abuses denounced by members of the public.

At 05.00 every morning, a special programme for farmers, *La Finca de Hoy* (The Farm Today), spends 60 minutes looking at issues related to farming and rural life.

Caracol Television has an international distribution arm called **Caracol Internacional** www.caracolinternacional.com, based in **Miami**, Florida.

This syndicates Caracol productions, particularly its popular *telenovelas*, to other broadcasters around the world.

Technically it is a local comercial channel that only broadcasts to the capital **Bogotá**,

However, in reality CityTV is widely viewed throughout Colombia on cable and satellite.

The channel belongs to **Casa Editorial El Tiempo**, the owner of **El Tiempo**, Colombia's largest and most influential quality newspaper.

It broadcasts news and a wide variety of entertainment programming.

According to the **Estudio General de Medios (EGM)** media audience survey for 2011, 30.7% of all televisión viewers in Colombia had watched City TV at some point in the previous month.

The EGM found that City TV was watched by 56.5% of viewers in Bogotá,.

The channel carries two editions per day of its main news programme, *City Noticias*.

The lunchtime news show goes out at 12.00.

A slightly longer evening news programme is broadcast at 20.00.

Casa Editorial El Tiempo, the group which owns City TV, was formerly controlled by the Santos family – a major player in Liberal politics.

The Colombian billionaire banker and industrialist **Luis Carlos Sarmiento Angulo**, who was previously a minority shareholder, acquired full control of the media group in May 2012.

Print overview

Newspapers mainly circulate in Colombia's cities and large towns.

Very few are sold in the countryside

Newspapers are influential in breaking news stories and shaping public opinion.

But according to the annual **Estudio General de Medios (EGM)** annual media audience survey, but only one in three Colombians reads a daily newspaper regularly.

Although newspapers and magazines are less widely used than television and radio as a source of news and information, increasing public access to the internet has given them a new online readership.

The most popular news website in the country is that of **El Tiempo** www.eltiempo.com, Colombia's largest and most authoritative quality daily newspaper.

It was attracting nearly 1.5 million unique visitors per week in early 2012, according to the EGM.

According to the internet analysis website www.alexa.com, El Tiempo was the 11th most visited website in the country in November 2012.

El Tiempo's main rival, **El Espectador** www.elespectador.com was in 16th position with 872,000 unique visitors per month.

Just over 40% of Colombia's population used the internet in 2011, according to the International Telecommunications Union (ITU) www.itu.int

Another factor which has helped to maintain newspaper readership is the launch of a new generation of tabloid newspapers in Colombia's main cities.

These tabloids – some of which are distributed as free sheets - specialise in human interest stories, crime, sport, show business and local news.

They are written in plain language and are mostly aimed at the poorer, less educated sectors of society. Many of these people would not have been regular newspaper readers beforehand.

The most successful of the new paid-for new tabloids is **Q'Hubo** (What's Up), which was launched in 2005. By 2012 it had more than two million readers nationwide.

ADN, a free sheet launched in **Bogota, Medellin, Cali** and **Cartagena** by the owners of **El Tiempo**, has also been hugely successful.

Al Día, which is distributed along the Caribbean coast by the owners of the **Barranquilla** regional daily **El Herald**, has also proved another big hit.

It acquired nearly 500,000 readers in its first five years of existence.

Nearly all of Colombian daily newspapers have long-standing links with one of the country's two main political parties; the Liberals and the Conservatives.

Several newspapers published in **Bogotá**, claim to be national in character and some of them have satellite printing plants in other cities.

But in reality, the Bogota papers sell most of their copies in the capital.

There are dozens of regional dailies. These are published in the main provincial capitals.

Three national newspapers claim a daily readership of more than one million (although their daily print runs are much lower).

These are:

- **El Tiempo** www.eltiempo.com, Colombia's largest and most authoritative quality daily newspaper. It has been traditionally associated with the Liberal Party. El Tiempo claimed daily sales of more than 300,000 in 2010. The EGM media survey in early 2012, indicated that the newspaper had more than 1.1 million daily readers on weekdays. The popular Sunday edition of El Tiempo was read by nearly 2.0 million people each week, it noted.
- **Q'Hubo** www.qhubo.com This popular tabloid tells human interest stories, crime, sports and local news in plain language. It produces 14 regional editions. These are printed locally in the main cities of the central highlands and the Caribbean coast. Q'Hubo was launched in 2005 by **Grupo Nacional de Medios (GNM)**, a consortium of regional daily newspapers. These provide its printing facilities. Q'Hubo claimed 2.2 million readers in 2012.
- **ADN** <http://diarioadn.co>. This free sheet newspaper was launched by **Casa Editorial El Tiempo**, the owner of **El Tiempo** and **City TV**, in 2009. It publishes four separate editions in the cities of **Bogotá**, **Cali**, **Medellin** and **Barranquilla**. In 2012 ADN claimed to have nearly 1.3 million readers.

El Tiempo was formerly controlled by the Santos family – a major player in Liberal politics. The current head of state, President Juan Manuel Santos, is the latest leading politician to be produced by this family.

In 2007, the Santos family sold a 55% stake in **Casa Editorial El Tiempo**, the publishing group which runs the newspaper, to Spain's **Planeta** media and publishing group.

In March 2012, Planeta sold out to the Colombian billionaire banker and industrialist **Luis Carlos Sarmiento Angulo**.

He already owned a 33% minority stake in the group. In May 2012 Sarmiento Angulo bought out the other minority shareholders to acquire 100% ownership of Casa Editorial El Tiempo.

El Tiempo newspaper retains a generally pro-Liberal stance under its new ownership.

Its main rival is another pro-Liberal Bogotá daily - **El Espectador** www.elespectador.com.

This belongs to **Grupo Santodomingo**, the Colombian business conglomerate which also owns **Caracol Television**.

A financial crisis forced El Espectador to abandon daily publication between 2001 and 2008. During this period it became a weekly.

El Espectador now appears daily again. The printed edition of the paper had about 250,000 readers in 2012, according to the EGM.

Colombia's traditional business daily is **La República** www.larepublica.com.co. It forms part of the **GNM** regional newspaper group, which publishes **Q'Hubo**.

In recent years, La República has been challenged by **Portafolio** www.portafolio.co, a business daily launched by **Casa Editorial El Tiempo**.

El Espacio www.elespacio.com.co is a sensationalist down-market tabloid, published in **Bogotá**, which specialises in crime and human interest stories.

It used to be Colombia's largest tabloid newspaper, but its circulation has fallen sharply in recent years as a result of competition with the new titles **Q'Hubo** and **ADN**.

El Espacio had a readership of 226,000 in 2012, according to the EGM media survey.

- **El Colombiano** www.elcolombiano.com.co – a conservative daily newspaper in **Medellín**. El Colombiano is the largest of Colombia's traditional regional dailies. According to the EGM it had a readership of 179,000 in early 2012. El Colombiano also owns **La República** in Bogota. It forms part of **GNM**, the regional newspaper consortium that owns **Q'Hubo**.
- **El País** www.elpais.com.co – a Conservative daily published in **Cali**. It forms part of **GNM**, the regional newspaper consortium that owns **Q'Hubo**.

- **El Herald** www.elheraldo.com.co – a Liberal newspaper published in **Barranquilla**. It is the most influential newspaper on the Caribbean coast.
- **Al Dia** – A free sheet tabloid newspaper launched by **El Herald** in Barranquilla in 2007. It had 477,000 readers in early 2012, according to the EGM media survey, three times as many as **El Herald** itself
- **Vanguardia Liberal** www.vanguardia.com – a Liberal daily published in **Bucaramanga**. It is influential in Santander department. Vanguardia Liberal forms part of **GNM**, the regional newspaper consortium that owns **Q’Hubo**.
- **La Opinion** www.laopinion.com.co - a daily newspaper published in **Cúcuta** near the Venezuelan frontier
- **La Patria** www.lapatria.com – a Conservative daily published in **Manizales**, the centre of Colombia’s main coffee growing area
- **Llano 7 dias** – A daily newspaper published in **Villavicencio**, the gateway to Colombia’s eastern plains

Surprisingly perhaps, Colombians read magazines more than newspapers.

The 2011 EGM media survey found that 34.3% of the 12,000 people questioned in 15 cities across the country read a daily newspaper.

However, 43.3% said they read magazines.

The most widely read weekly magazines are:

Colombia’s main news agency is **Colprensa** www.colprensa.com.

It was set up in 1981 as a cooperative of regional newspapers to provide them all with national news.

Colprensa distributes news and pictures through its website.

The **Estudio General de Medios (EGM)** media survey indicated that the Monday to Saturday editions of El Tiempo had more than 1.1 million daily readers in early 2012 (with several people reading each copy of the newspaper sold).

El Tiempo's nationwide readership rose to nearly 2.0 million on Sundays, the same survey showed.

El Tiempo has traditionally supported the Liberal Party. For decades the newspaper was owned by the Santos family, which has played a leading role in Liberal politics for several generations.

The current head of state, President Juan Manuel Santos, is the latest leading politician to emerge from its ranks.

The Santos family sold a 55% majority stake in **Casa Editorial El Tiempo**, the media group which publishes El Tiempo, to the Spanish media and publishing group **Planeta** in 2007.

In March 2012, Planeta sold out to the Colombian billionaire banker and industrialist **Luis Carlos Sarmiento Angulo**.

In May 2012 Sarmiento Angulo bought out the other minority shareholders to acquire 100% ownership of Casa Editorial El Tiempo.

The media group also owns **City TV**, Colombia's third most popular television channel, the free-sheet newspaper **ADN**, which circulates in the country's four largest cities, the down-market tabloid, **Diario Mio**, and the financial daily **Portafolio**.

It also owns a stable of magazines.

El Tiempo publishes several regional editions to boost its appeal in the interior.

It has satellite printing plants in **Barranquilla** and **Cali**.

But it fell on hard times during the first decade of the 20th century and is still recovering from a near death experience.

El Espectador stopped daily publication between 2001 and 2008 as the result of a financial crisis and became a weekly instead.

The newspaper then resumed daily publication.

El Espectador has started to rebuild its circulation and it has retained its reputation as a reliable and balanced source of news.

According to the **Estudio General de Medios (EGM)** media survey in early 2012, the newspaper had 250,000 readers (although its print run would have been considerably lower).

In November 2012, the internet analysis website www.alexa.com ranked El Espectador's website as the second most popular source of online news in Colombia after that of El Tiempo.

The EGM survey reported that El Espectador's website attracted 872,000 unique visitors per month.

Since 1997, El Espectador has been owned by **Grupo Santodomingo**, one of Colombia's largest privately owned business conglomerates.

Grupo Santodomingo's other media assets include **Caracol Television**, which is one of Colombia's two largest TV networks, the weekly magazine **Cromos** and the Bogota news and current affairs radio station **Blu Radio**.

Q'Hubo (What's Up) is Colombia's top-selling tabloid daily newspaper.

It claimed more than 2.2 million readers in 2012 (although sales of printed would have been substantially lower).

Q'Hubo was launched in 2008 by a consortium of regional daily newspapers called **Grupo Nacional de Medios (GNM)**.

These were keen to develop newspaper sales in the interior of Colombia by creating a product that was attractive and accessible to the lower income groups

Q'Hubo offers a mix of crime and human interest stories, sport show business and local news.

Q'Hubo's focus on local news told in plain language, its low cover price and its ability to distribute in large areas of the interior early in the day have been important factors in its success.

The newspaper produces 14 different regional editions. These are printed on the presses of GNM member newspapers in different cities across Colombia.

Q'Hubo says that most of its sales take place within these cities, but around 14% are sold in the surrounding areas.

Its cover price of 700 pesos (39 US cents) is less than half that of El Tiempo, which costs 1,500 pesos (83 US cents).

Q'Hubo is distributed in 12 departments in the central highlands and along the Caribbean coast. Together, these contain about 75% of Colombia's population.

Online media

A large and growing number of Colombians in the middle and upper income groups have access to the internet.

They increasingly use news websites and social media as a source of news and information.

According to the International Telecommunications Union (ITU), 40.4% of Colombians used the internet in 2011.

The **Estudio General de Medios (EGM)** all-media survey for 2011 indicated a slightly higher figure of 43.4%

The EGM found that internet usage varied from about 20% in low income groups to 70% in middle income groups and 84% amongst wealthy Colombians.

However, the internet is still largely the preserve of urban Colombians.

Internet access in the countryside – where 25% of the population lives – remains low.

Those Colombians who do go online are enthusiastic users of social media.

The internet traffic analysis website www.socialbakers.com said there were nearly 17.7 million Facebook users in the country in December 2012 – equivalent to nearly 40% of the population.

This figure indicates that almost every internet user in Colombia has a Facebook account.

Facebook has been used in Colombia to organise political protests.

In 2008, Facebook was the main vehicle for organising one of the largest demonstrations ever held against the FARC leftist guerrilla movement.

Most newspapers and commercial radio and television stations have their own websites and Twitter feeds.

Many of these are extremely popular.

Social Bakers listed 13 news organisations among the 50 most followed Twitter accounts in Colombia in December 2012.

The websites of the national newspapers **El Tiempo** and **El Espectador** both feature amongst the 20 most visited websites in Colombia.

The Twitter accounts of **El Tiempo** newspaper and **Caracol Television** have more followers than any other Twitter account in Colombia, apart from that of the pop music star Shakira.

According to Social Bakers, each newspaper had about one million Twitter followers at the end of 2012.

www.eltiempo.com, the website of **El Tiempo** newspaper, is the country's most popular source of online news.

According to the internet traffic analysis website www.alexa.com, it was the 11th most visited website in Colombia in December 2012.

An EGM survey in early 2012 found that El Tiempo's website attracted nearly 1.5 million unique visitors per week.

Alexa ranked **El Espectador** www.elespectador.com as the second most visited news website in Colombia and the 16th most popular website in the country.

It received 872,000 visits per week in early 2012, according to the EGM.

Colombia's two main television networks are also popular sources of online news and information.

According to the EGM, www.caracoltv.com, the website of **Caracol Television**, received 850,000 unique visits per week in early 2012.

By the end of the year, the TV network's Twitter account *@caracoltv* had accumulated 967,000 followers.

The website of **RCN TV** www.canalrcnmsn.com is also popular. It received 829,000 visits per week in early 2012, according to the EGM.

Several regional media outlets also have a strong online presence.

Internet access

Internet access in Colombia is widespread and growing fast – especially in urban areas.

By the end of September 2012, there were at least 7.0 million internet subscribers on both fixed and mobile connections, according to government statistics.

6.9 million were on broadband.

The government, through its *Vive Digital* www.vivedigital.gov.co project aims to increase the number of internet subscribers to 8.8 million by 2014.

Its target is to have 50% of all homes and small businesses connected to the internet by that date.

In 2010, when *Vive Digital* was launched, only 27% of homes were connected to the internet, according to the Ministry of Information Technology and Communications.

However, the Ministry noted in a 2011 update on the project that the poorest third of Colombia's population still had virtually no access to the internet at all.

Vive Digital is encouraging the development of a nationwide fibre-optic cable network and improved access to the internet via the mobile phone network.

The government aims to connect at least 700 of Colombia's 1,102 municipalities to the fibre optic network by 2014.

These 700 municipalities contain about 90% of the country's population.

Only 200 municipalities were connected to the fibre-optic backbone in 2010 when the four-year *Vive Digital* project was launched.

In 2012, many rural municipalities linked to the internet still relied on a satellite connection.

3G mobile networks, which allow internet access at broadband speeds, are now available in most Colombian towns.

Colombia's first 4G mobile networks, which allow even faster and more sophisticated internet services such as television to be accessed by mobile phone, were launched in 2011.

By the end of 2012 they covered Colombia's largest cities.

Home access to the internet has been facilitated by the rapid expansion of cable television.

This allows a cheap internet connection to be made via the same cable.

By 2012 there were more than 3.9 million cable TV subscribers in Colombia according to the Ministry of Information Technology and Communications www.mintic.gov.co .

There were about 40 city-based commercial cable TV networks. The largest were controlled by telecoms companies that also operate landline networks.

In addition, there were more than 760 Community TV cable networks.

These are allowed a maximum of 15,000 subscribers. Many of them serve small and remote towns and villages.

The government facilitates internet access in remote areas of the country and among low income groups through its network of more than 3,000 *telecentros*.

These neighbourhood facilities, operated by private contractors, provide telephone, fax and internet access to members of the public.

The government is also promoting computer training and internet access in schools.

The *Vive Digital* project aims to equip nearly 30,000 schools with internet access by 2014.

Achieving this target would give 94% of school pupils access to the internet.

The government is putting 1.2 million computers into schools to achieve a ratio of one computer per eight pupils.

Sistema de Comunicacion para la Paz (SIPAZ)

The System of Peace Communication - *Sistema de Comunicacion para la Paz (SIPAZ)* is a Canadian-funded project that works with more than 40 local radio stations to promote peace in areas of Colombia affected by conflict.

It was created during the 1990s in reaction to the fact that many community radio stations were losing ground to their commercial counterparts.

SIPAZ does not report directly on conflict, but it works with local NGOs and radio stations to promote discussion of its consequences on the air waves.

It also emphasises the positive action taken by local communities to rebuild their lives.

The project is mainly financed by Canada's International Development Research Centre (IDRC) www.idrc.ca.

From a hub of 10 centres linking 42 community radio stations and two local television stations, SIPAZ produces a news programme. All the stations contribute news and other materials.

The programme is then channelled through the 10 centres and sent, via the Internet, to all the participating stations and partners around the country.

Although SIPAZ operates in areas where violence is particularly intense, it has chosen not to cover conflict and violent incidents.

Covering such events, it feels, would greatly endanger the lives of its members, and there is already sufficient mass media coverage of these events.

SIPAZ does, however, report on the aftermath and consequences of these conflicts and their wider social context.

Stations have learned how to turn local events and activities that support community development into news items of regional interest.

Telecommunications overview

Nearly everyone in Colombia has a mobile phone.

An increasing number of people in the middle and upper income groups use mobile devices to go online as well as to talk and send text messages.

Literacy rates in Colombia are high - nine out of 10 adults can read and write - so most mobile phone owners are keen users of SMS text messages.

Many people also use their phones to take photos, listen to FM radio stations and make payments from their bank account.

It is common for petty traders in the street to allow members of the public to use their mobile phones to make personal calls for a charge.

Colombia had 48.7 million active mobile lines by September 2012, according to the 2012 third quarter statistical bulletin of the Ministry of Information Technology and Communication www.mintic.gov.co/index.php/cifras

This gave the country a mobile penetration rate of 104.2%.

Some of the poorest people in Colombia and some people in remote areas without network coverage still do not possess a mobile phone.

However, many Colombians own two or more handsets.

More than 80% of mobile phone owners use pre-paid credit.

The cost of a voice call for pre-paid mobile subscribers use ranges from 12 to 30 US cents per minute, depending on the operator and the payment plan used.

SMS messages cost five to 12 US cents each.

The country is dominated by three large mobile networks:

- **Claro** www.claro.com.co. This company, which was formerly known as Comcel, is the market leader. Claro had 30 million subscribers and a market share of 61.5% in September 2012, according to government figures. Claro also has more extensive geographic coverage than any other mobile network. It is owned by the Mexican telecoms group **América Móvil**.
- **Movistar** www.movistar.co. This is Colombia's second largest mobile operator, with 12 million subscribers and a market share of 24.6%. It is owned by Spanish telecoms giant **Telefónica**.

- **Tigo** www.tigo.com.co is the third largest mobile network with 6.4 million customers and a market share of 13.1%. It is controlled by **Millicom International**, a Luxembourg-based telecoms group which operates several mobile networks in Latin America and the Caribbean. The municipal fixed line phone companies of **Bogota** and **Medellin** own minority stakes in Tigo.

Between them, Claro, Movistar and Tigo have signed up more than 99% of all mobile phone subscribers in Colombia.

Their networks cover the densely populated areas of the central highlands and the Caribbean coast quite thoroughly.

However, mobile coverage is patchy in the sparsely populated eastern plains, the tropical forests of the deep south and along the Pacific coast.

Internet access

There were more than seven million internet subscribers in Colombia at the end of September 2012, according to government figures.

Of these, nearly half accessed the internet via a mobile device.

The number of people going online via the mobile network increased by 23% to 3.3 million in the 12 months to September 2012

3G services, which allow internet access at broadband speeds, are widely available in the main towns.

More remote areas only have slow-speed 2G mobile networks.

Colombia began to roll out 4G services in 2011.

These allow high bandwidth internet services, such as internet television, to be accessed from mobile devices.

By the end of 2012, 4G networks were due to be up and running in all the country's largest cities.

Access to the internet from a mobile phone can cost as little as 50 US cents per day or US\$15 per month.

By September 2012, 84% of internet subscribers in Colombia used a broadband connection with a speed of at least 1,024 kbps.

Most internet users belong to the upper and middle income groups.

Poorer people, if they use the internet at all, are more likely to go online at internet cafes or the network of more than *telecentros* – community telecommunications centres set up by the government.

In late 2012, over half of the 3.7 million internet subscribers who used a fixed line connection lived in Colombia's four largest cities: **Bogotá, Medellín, Cali, Barranquilla.**

90% of fixed line connections were in individual homes. The remainder were nearly all in businesses and government offices.

Decline in landlines

The boom in mobile phone use over the past decade has been accompanied by a slow but steady decline in the use of landline phones.

Landlines are now widely used to offer internet access and cable TV as well as voice communication.

Colombia had just under 6.2 million fixed line telephone subscribers in September 2012.

The landline network is fragmented between several different companies.

However, it is dominated by five large operators.

Two are owned by **América Móvil** and **Telefónica**, the Mexican and Spanish telecoms giants that also run Colombia's largest mobile networks.

The other three are owned by the municipal authorities of Colombia's three biggest cities; **Bogotá, Medellín** and **Cali.**

The main landline networks are:

- **ETB** www.etb.com.co the municipally owned telephone company which dominates the market in Bogotá. This is Colombia's largest fixed line network, with 1.6 million subscribers. It offers mobile services in association with Tigo.
- **Movistar** www.movistar.co, a subsidiary of Spanish telecoms group **Telefonica**. It also operates Colombia's second largest mobile network under the Movistar brand.
- **UNE** www.une.com.co a **Medellin**-based landline network which also offers mobile services in association with **Tigo**.
- **Claro** www.claro.com.co, the Mexican-owned telecoms group which also owns Colombia's largest mobile network.
- **EMCali** www.emcali.com.co, a landline network based in **Cali** that is owned by the city's municipal authority.

Internet development plan

Besides dominating Colombia's mobile phone market, Claro is the country's fourth largest operator of fixed line phones.

According to the Ministry of Information Technology and Communications, Claro had 846,000 fixed line subscribers in September 2012.

This gave it a 13.7% share of Colombia's fixed line telecoms market.

In October 2012, Claro claimed to provide 3.5G mobile network coverage in 932 of Colombia's 1.102 municipalities.
